Important Dates:

Sunsmart Period:

The 1st of May sparks when our SunSmart period ends. The wearing of hats is not currently mandated, however we still encourage SunSmart practices all year round. The SunSmart period runs between 1st September and 30th April each year.

Sorry Day and Reconciliation Week:

The 26th of May marks the anniversary of the tabling of the Bringing Them Home report in parliament in 1997 and commemorates stolen generation survivors. National Reconciliation week follows this between 27th May-3rd June. This year's theme Bridging Now to Next calls on all Australian's to step forward together, to look ahead and let past lessons guide us.

IDAHOBIT:

NAPLAN:

The DET has released preliminary NAPLAN results to schools from the 2025 testing. The school continues to perform strongly, and we look forward to unpacking these results with staff in the coming weeks. Confirmed results and individual reports will be coming home in the coming weeks.

Attitudes to School Survey:

As they do each year students in Years 4-6 will participate in the Attitudes to School Survey in the coming weeks. The survey is completed at school and is organised by our staff. Further information will be distributed to parents about this process and there is an option to opt out for those parents/carers that don't wish for their child to participate.

District Cross Country:

Today approximately 60 of our year 3-6 students are completing at the District Cross Country event. We congratulate them on making our school representative team and wish them all the best. Many thanks to Miss Massa, Ms Sullivan, Michelle Lewis and those parents/carers in attendance for supporting our students at this event.

School Savings Bonus:

The Victorian Government is delivering the School Saving Bonus (SSB) – a one-off support of \$400 for eligible government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025.

The SSB can be used for uniforms and textbooks until Monday 30 June 2025.

Any funds remaining after 30 June 2025, including online voucher amounts that have not been redeemed, will become a credit to use on school activities. However, the credit will not be available on your family account at our school until late July. To use any remaining SSB funds to cover the cost of school activities in July, please refer to the SSB online system and allocate the funds to school activities before 30 June 2025. To learn more about the SSB online system, download the step-by-step System guide for parents and carers (DOCX, 945KB) or watch this School Saving Bonus video. System guide translations are also available in 14 languages. The Department of Education's SSB contact centre will remain available until 30 June 2025.




