### 2026 Enrolments:

The school is currently working through our prep enrolment offers for next year. If there are any families in our community that has a sibling looking to start next year and hasn't submitted an enrolment application form with the office, I urge you to do so soon so we can finalise class sizes and structure. The school is currently at our functional capacity and DET have placed an enrolment cap on our school limiting any further 2026 prep enrolments to those in our zone or those with sibling claims.

### 2026 Student Requests:

As reported in our last newsletter we are starting the process of considering grade structures for next year.

If parents have any requests that need to be considered for their child in 2026, these must be sent through via email to the Principal. Ideally we like to receive these requests during Term3, but they must be received by October 31<sup>st</sup> at the latest. Requests received following this date, won't be considered. Please note that this process is not to select your child's teacher but rather to put forward any special circumstances that need to be considered. Any concerns raised in previous years will not be considered unless it is sent again for the following year. This is because many issues or previous concerns from prior years are historical and may no longer be relevant. Please do not put requests through to staff. Please also note that whilst the school actively considers parent requests around special circumstances, there are many factors that go into the composition of classes, and not all requests can be accommodated. Thank-you in advance for following this process.

### **Student Safety:**

As a school we are focussed on providing a safe and secure learning environment and our care extends beyond the school grounds. Families are reminded of the regular need to continue educating our students of issues such as being safe around our streets. This includes being aware of traffic dangers (using crossings), stranger danger and being cyber safe.

Below are some helpful hints when considering what to tell your child about stranger danger:

- Students need to know not to converse with unknown people.
- Tell your child not to listen to or be near a stranger-rather to move away or back inside.
- Tell your child to never ever go with a stranger-no matter what the stranger says.
- Tell your child that strangers may make up sad stories, like looking for a lost pet, needing help with a sick child, or needing directions.
- Tell your child that a stranger should never be believed, no matter what they say.
- Tell your child that strangers may offer treats, gifts or lollies for 'helping'.
- Tell your child that you will never send a stranger to collect them. Make a list of the only, known people, you would send to pick them up.
- Ensure your child knows the routines of arriving and departing school safely and notify them of any changes to the 'normal' arrangements
- Tell your child to go immediately back inside and ask a trusted adult if unsure.
- Practice makes perfect. Encourage your child to 'tell' if they even think they came across a stranger.
- Encourage your child to 'tell' if they felt scared, unsure or uncomfortable ('yucky' with any adult). Affirm that you will be happy and praise them for 'telling'—that they won't be in






# New signalised pedestrian crossing on Diamond Creek Road in Greensborough



Project update July 2025



### What we're doing

We're building a new signalised pedestrian crossing on Diamond Creek Road, south of Greenhill Road in Greensborough to improve pedestrian safety and access to bus stops.

As part of the improvements, we will also:

- Relocate the northbound bus stop at Greenhill Road/Diamond Creek Road approximately 100m south so it's closer to the new signalised pedestrian crossing.
- Remove the existing pedestrian refuge north of Greenhill Road.
- Install pedestrian fencing in the median of the new signalised pedestrian crossing.

- Consolidate bus stops with low usage in the area by permanently closing the bus stops at Avandina Crescent/ Diamond Creek Road and Spring Street/ Diamond Creek Road.
- Trim and remove two trees and some low-lying vegetation.

To make these improvements, we will need to remove up to four on-street parking spaces outside 100 and 102 Diamond Creek Road.





### What's next

We're currently in the development stage of the project, which involves undertaking technical assessments and site investigations that will inform the final design.

Major construction works to build the new pedestrian crossing are expected to begin in early 2026.

## Why we're doing it

The section of Diamond Creek Road between Civic Drive and St Helena Road is a key connection to local schools and amenities.



The new signalised pedestrian crossing will improve pedestrian safety for everyone, including local students and bus users.

Between May and July 2023, there were two crashes resulting in the serious injury of two students within this section of road.

Australian Government

Pedestrians are completely exposed to the full force of a crash, making them some of the most vulnerable road users. The new signalised pedestrian crossing will assist pedestrians to safely cross the road, including students and bus users accessing the bus stops.

This project is jointly funded by the Australian Government and Victorian Government under the Road Safety Program.
