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Michael Kent - PRINCIPAL

Hello everyone and I hope you all enjoyed the recent weekend and perhaps took the opportunity of travelling out of greater Melbourne and perhaps enjoyed some of your extended family and friends.. We look forward to this weekend when we hope to hear more from the Government about a further easing of restrictions and what this will mean for the remaining weeks of term 4.

Firstly, WOW - \$7.884M in funding for our school to redevelop our facilities.

Yesterday we welcomed the opportunity to receive a call from our local member Colin Brooks, whom shared the great news with me. Colin has been a long time supporter of our school and has continued to transparently communicate with me around the local and broader issues facing the government and also the related funding commitments over recent years. This wonderful announcement will be outlined in Tuesday's state budget. I thank Colin for his support and commitment to education. No doubt this investment in infrastructure will benefit our students and those

to come but also have an immediate positive impact our helping to stimulate our economy and associated workforces. At this early stage, we don't know exactly what this will entail and how wide stretching this will be but we will be maximising the opportunity to invest in our students and community! I will keep you informed as things progress and further details are known. This will include information around community consultation, timelines, impacts and opportunities.

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Events and Activities

As you know there are still restrictions in place for some school activities and events. These may well be reviewed in coming weeks as we await further announcements from the Government and Department. However, we are excited to know that our camping program can continue as per our normal bookings. Meaning that our Year 5/6 students and our Year 2 students can attend their camps. Documentation has been sent home to these respective year levels and we ask that you return the appropriate permissions etc.. asap to support our planning processes. Similarly, we are happy to be able to conduct our Prep breakfast and Year 1 Dinner in coming weeks. We are planning to host an onsite camp style experience for our year 3/4 students as their offsite camp day has unfortunately already passed.

2020 School Fees

This week you will have received a family fee statement outlining the 2020 school fees and indicating some credits for associated costs for this year. It sure has been quite extraordinary year and as a result we have amended the costs for 2020. Please note that there may be anomalies within these statements and if you have any questions, please contact me or the office so we can clarify and rectify any discrepancies. We appreciate your patience as we attempt to make this process as seamless as possible. A few points to note:

- We have credited camps where appropriate
- For Year Prep and Year 1; the camp costs have been incorporated into the 'school activities' section of the statements. For Year 3/4 the camp costs are amended as this
- won't occur this year. However, we are planning a modified school based experience that will incur a reduced cost
- Again, this is incorporated in the 'school activities' section of the statements.
- Year 2 and Year 5/6 camps are going ahead as planned, accordingly the costs are included in your statements.
- For all families, the 'school excursions' section is also reduced due to the reduced amount of activities conducted this year.
- Please note that swimming and sport levies are also credited/amended accordingly for all year levels.
- Essential items have been reduced due to the modified requirements for 2020. Please note that we have incurred some different resourcing costs to support students this year, but have not required the same amount of physical resources during this year.

If you are an exiting family, we will reimburse you with any differences in what you've already paid vs incurred costs. If you are an existing family, we will apply any potential credits from this year to your school fees in 2021. Please note that this will be automatically 'rolled over' to 2021.

You will have also received the 2021 school fee documentation. We ask that you complete this paperwork and return to the school by December 10th. This does not need to include payments at this stage, but simply returning the documentation will allow us to prepare for the 2021 school year in establishing your family accounts for next year.

Remembrance Day

The school took the proud opportunity of observing the recent Remembrance day acknowledgements in reciting the Ode to Remembrance, observing one minute of silence and listening to The Last Post. Students and staff also took the opportunity to focus some attention on our men and women who have served and continue to serve our great nation so admirably. Once of our Year 2 students, Lucas penned some writing about this special day.

2021

If you are planning on departing WHPS for any reason in 2021, please contact me asap so that places can be offered to those on enrolment waiting lists.

2021 planning is well underway. Please note that any requests for grade placements are to be emailed to me directly. Please refrain from contacting classroom teachers in regard to this. All requests will be directed to me. Please also be aware that this process is for special considerations, not to request certain teachers.

Transition

As we look ahead to next year we are very mindful to ensure a smooth and supported transition for students as they move on to their next year level. As a part of this process we will be having a few transition sessions in coming weeks (the first this week). During these sessions, students will be mixed up into different groups to simulate 2021 classes. These groups are not necessarily the class group for next year, but more an opportunity for children to prepare for the ensuing change and also to get to know some students from different classes and year levels. The teacher whom takes these groups is NOT the teacher of this year level or class in 2021.

We take this opportunity as a staff to spread around and take different groups of students. In the coming weeks we will be able to finalise the grade lists and also confirm the teachers that will be teaching each class.

I remind any parents whom have any special requests or circumstances for consideration to email me directly.

Prep Transitions

This week, we welcomed our 2021 Prep students for their second transition session for the year. In small groups, the students enjoyed opportunity to familiarise themselves with the school, the classrooms, the staff and their peers. We look forward to providing further opportunities in coming weeks. Hopefully we will be allowed to offer these in larger groups as the term unfolds. We have also provided a virtual Prep Information Night via pre-recorded videos.

Hello everyone. The school has been a very busy place over the past few weeks with activities around NAIDOC week, Remembrance Day and events such as school photos. As the number of double donut days rack up and some restrictions have been eased, our staff have been working hard to cram as many allowable activities into the remainder of the term as possible, whilst still maintaining a strong learning focus. It is our hope that this will enrich the schooling experience as much as possible in what has been a very challenging year.

It is in this spirit that we are busily pulling together the arrangements required to conduct the Year 2 and the 5/6 Camp in the coming weeks after these restrictions were eased. Parents of students in these year levels, please keep an eye out for any communications coming home and return required information as soon as possible to assist these camp arrangements to be made.

Speaking of enriching the school experience, we also strive to do this through creating a vibrant and colourful school environment. Over the past week we have added a fantastic new art mural to the side of the Dance Hall. This large mural measures approximately 7 X 2.5 metres and is inspired by the classic picture storybook **Where The Forest Meets The Sea** by Jeannie Baker. This amazing art was created for the school by Viv Degran who many of our community will recall worked at the school previously as a student aide. This new mural will complement the Roald Dahl mural near the BER that was also created by Viv a couple of years ago.

1:1 iPad Program:

As the year draws on, I thought it was worth reminding our year 2 parents about our 1:1 iPad program for students in years 3-6. The school has distributed handbook information about this program a number of weeks ago and we aim to provide more information via video in the days ahead. Whilst parents are welcome to use an existing family iPad or to source a new iPad from any supplier, the school has an online portal relationship with JB HiFi where we believe the prices are very competitive. This is established by the school to provide an easy and cost effective method of purchase. Parents of students in other year levels are welcome to purchase through this portal if they are in the market for a new iPad. Details of the online portal can be found in the following pages. Parents are welcome to make contact with myself should you have any questions about the program.

Glenice St Parking:

The school is very mindful that our parking options in the immediate area adjacent to the school are limited. We appreciate those that take up the option to walk, ride or scoot their way to school or those that park a little further away and walk a short distance to meet their children. This assists the congestion levels around the school. We understand that the council has recently made some changes to the parking arrangements in Glenice St with parking limited to one side of the street. We have been notified that parking inspectors are likely to be patrolling this area in the coming weeks.

Transitions:

Our school is ramping up our transition processes both for those students entering or graduating from the school. Our 2021 incoming preps have been invited in small groups to visit the school and spend some time with our current prep teachers becoming familiar with the school environment and each other. Our year 6 students are also having contact with their secondary schools. For some of these schools this still can't be facilitated on site at this point but other transition activities are taking place. Our staff are also liaising with local kinders and secondary schools to ensure these transitions are as smooth as possible for students.

In addition to these external transitions the school has started the process of providing opportunities for students to participate in mixed grouping activities across the next few weeks. These are not grade groups for next year and teachers are randomly assigned to groups. It's an opportunity for students to interact more with students from other classes and to build new friendships in preparation for the transition of year levels ahead.

I know Michael has shared this information with the school community but I can't let this opportunity go to express how excited we are by the news that our school has secured \$7.884 million dollars funding from the state government to rebuild and modernise the school facilities!

We have always worked hard to maintain our buildings and create as dynamic a learning environment as possible, which is a challenge considering the school is approaching 60 years of age. This announcement is very exciting as it will assist our school to create a physical environment that is modern, flexible, innovative and collaborative, which will more closely reflect our teaching practice and the learning culture our community has strived hard to create. Much more information to come in terms of timelines and design but a very exciting development

SCIENCE

Science Club started with a BOOM, CRASH and BANG! Our keen scientists learned about volcanoes for our very first Science Club meeting and conducted the classic bicarb soda and vinegar experiment, creating some excellent volcanic explosions! Keeping with the theme of major geological events, in our second meeting we discovered more about earthquakes and conducted an earthquake simulator competition.

Each team had to construct a block tower more than 50cm in height and these were then put to the test on our earthquake simulator. Our winning tower was 85cm tall and withstood 15.65 seconds on the simulator.

This week we switched our attention to extreme weather events and in particular cyclones, with the team building vortex makers and taking turns to see if we could knock over a tower of plastic cups with the swirling air we created! Science Club runs each Wednesday after lunch eating time with the assistance of our Science Leaders Lily and Matthias. The final Science Club for 2020 will run on Wednesday the 2nd of December but will be back in 2021!
