School Reports:

Semester 1 student reports were released on Wednesday afternoon. As noted in our previous newsletter and the report cover letter, the Department of Education has launched Victorian Curriculum 2.0 this year, which brings significant updates to the English and Mathematics curriculum across all year levels.

One major change is the shift from three progression point categories in Mathematics to a single progression point, making direct comparisons with last year's reports more complex. In some cases, students may appear to be in the same achievement band as in December 2024. This does not necessarily indicate a lack of progress; rather, it may reflect the relatively short time frame (six months) they've had to engage with the new content and consolidate their learning.

Please remember that comparisons are now being made across two different versions of the curriculum. As teachers and students continue to embed the revised framework, greater consistency in assessment outcomes is expected over time.

Milo's Birthday Party:

Today, our Prep students celebrated one of the highlights of their school year—Milo's Birthday Party! It was wonderful to see them dressed as their favourite animal characters from the Milo Monkey's Birthday Party book.

A huge thank you to our dedicated Prep teaching team, who went above and beyond to make the day special. The classrooms were full of balloons, decorations, and delicious smells from the cooking preparations much of which continued into Thursday evening. It's another fantastic example of how our staff go the extra mile to create a fun, engaging, and memorable experience for our students.

Term 3 Key Dates:

As always, Term 3 promises to be a vibrant and busy time, with many special events complementing our strong classroom learning programs:

• Weeks 3 & 4 (4th & 11th August) - WHPS Athletics Carnival:

This year, for the first time, we've split the carnival across two days to accommodate our growing student population and to ensure every student has the chance to participate in multiple events. Students will begin practicing these events in Sport classes from the start of term.

• Week 4 (13th August) – Science Fair:

Our senior students will present their creative and thought-provoking experiments to the school community which is always a highlight!

• Week 5 – Book Week Celebrations:

A range of exciting activities are planned throughout the week to celebrate the magic of books and storytelling.

• Week 7 (Friday 5th September) – Celebration of the Men in Our Community:

A special day to recognise and celebrate the positive male role models in our students' lives.

• Week 8 (Tuesday 9th & Wednesday 10th September) - School Concert:

Our major event for the term! Students are already preparing dances, rehearsing scenes, and working on props. It promises to be an unforgettable showcase of talent and teamwork.

• Week 10 (Monday 15th September) - Curriculum Day:

There will be no school for students as staff undertake First Aid Training.

School Concert Sponsorship:



ONE STEP AT A TIME PROGRAM: PARENTSUPPORT FOR CHILDHOOD ANXIETY

Swinburne Psychology Clinic

Parents / quardians:

Do you have a primary school-aged child experiencing symptoms of anxiety?

Clinicians at Swinburne University have developed a program to help parents manage childhood anxiety in children aged 6-11 years.

Does your child experience any of the following?

- Difficulties sleeping at night due to worries
- · Fears and phobias
- Difficulty separating from you or worrying about parental safety
- Trouble sleeping alone in their bed
- · Fear of the dark
- · Scared of lifts, trains, and people
- · Fear of dogs and other animals
- Excessive worry and constant reassurance seeking
- Fear of germs and other health problems

The One Step at a Time Program involves:

- Comprehensive psychological assessment of your child's anxiety
- Seven sessions of online counselling through video conferencing
- Parent-focused cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT) skills to help you manage and support your child's anxiety
- Two combined parent-child sessions
- Reflective parenting strategies
- Access to a website with selfhelp materials to supplement therapy.

Cost

\$20 per session/assessment. Treatment consists of seven therapy sessions plus one assessment session.




