## WHPS Writing Program

As you are aware all students in Years 1-6 are involved in our 'VCOP - Big Write' writing program. As an integral part of this program students are required to have conversations with people at home around a weekly topic focus. These conversations allow students to articulate their thoughts, gain other perspectives and prepare for their writing session back at school.
This is based on the notion that: "if you can't say it, you can't write it"
We need to encourage the development of language and listening skills to develop student's writing abilities. Your child will come home with a new topic each week. This will inform you of the genre of writing and the topic.
We ask that you talk to your child about this topic to help them with the content of their writing the following day.
To help you get the most out of their BIG TALK homework, we suggest that you:

- Encourage as many family members as possible to be involved in BIG Talk homework (not just the adults!!!)
- Switch off the TV! Try to ensure this is dedicated talking and listening time.
- When giving your opinion, use 'because' to explain why you think what you do.
- Ask others around the table to give their opinions, using 'because' also.
- Ask your child his/her opinion and have them use 'because' to explain their reasons
- Link to the past and future - talk about things you remember from when you were a child and how they differ now, and ... project forward to how things may be different in the future.
DON'T WRITE ANYTHING DOWN! Not only are we improving oral language, but we are also improving memory links.
VCOP
VCOP is focused teaching of:
V = Vocabulary
Teaches a wide range of WOW words (ambitious vocabulary)
$\mathbf{C}=$ Connectives
Teaches a wide range of words and phrases for connecting thoughts, ideas, sentences, etc. O = Openers


Teaches a wide range of ways of opening sentences, including sequencing words, linking words and phrases $\mathbf{P}=$ Punctuation
Teaches a wide range of punctuation, including power punctuation.

Hello WHPS Community, I hope everyone has had a positive week and the portfolio interviews on Thursday provided an insight into the progress your child is making towards their learning goals. Our students and teachers put a lot of work into presenting the portfolios and it is a great way to share in their learning journey.

## Building update:

Our building project continues to gather momentum. Increasingly the outside landscaping and concreting works is continuing to take shape. Inside the building, the painting of classrooms continued, and much of the cabinetry required has begun to be installed. It's exciting to see the fit out of classrooms and every week our anticipation builds towards the date that the school receives the building.

One thing to make our community aware of is that Yarra Valley Water have determined that the water services to the school need to be upgraded as part of our building development. This will mean that in the weeks ahead there are likely to be some traffic management implications around the school on Henry Street as these works are carried out. We are working with our builders to try to limit the impacts of this on the community as much as possible, but some disruption may be inevitable. We will keep the community posted as to how and when these works develop.

After a very chilly start, the weather turned on a magnificent day for our students as they run, hopped, jumped and threw their way around a number of events across the day. ## READING

We are starting Book Club in $5 / 6$ ! Students have been practising different roles when analysing books, such as Predictor, Clarifier, Questioner and Summariser. This assists the students with analysing texts from different perspectives and be able to comprehend texts on a deeper level.


We have also been practicing our spelling by using the Sound Mats. This useful tool helps us to identify which phoneme is appropriate when we are spelling new words.


During week 3 the grade $5 / 6$ cohort have been learning about fractions. The students have applied their knowledge of fractions to develop what they believe is the recipe for the most marvellous milkshake to ever exist. Everyone loved experimenting with the various ingredients to include in their milkshakes. The students are excited to turn their designs into the real deal next week when they create their milkshakes.

## MATHS

In Wellbeing this Term the grade $5 / 6$ 's have continued embedding the Zones of Regulation practices into their daily routines. Every time they come into the classroom, they have an opportunity to reflect on their current zone (red, yellow, green or blue). By taking the time to think about how they are feeling in the moment, the students then can consider what strategies they can use in order to move back to the green zone (optimal learning zone). Recently, all classrooms got an exciting delivery of sensory tools! They are used throughout the day along with their physical/mental strategies (moving our bodies or taking deep breaths). We are so excited to have this as a part of our daily program!
