School Arrival - 8:30 to 9am

We have recently noticed an increase in the number of students arriving after the bell. It is important that the students are in class, ready to commence learning at 9am sharp as we start our teaching immediately. Students who are late are missing essential learning. If your child arrives at 9.15, they are likely to have missed important instructional information that establishes the morning and daily focus. It is very difficult for students to maintain focus, when there is a stream of students arriving late. Please endeavour to have your child at school at 8.50 so they can complete the morning process and be ready to learn at 9am.

Additionally, we have a growing number of students arriving to school prior to 8.30am. In this instance students will be directed to our before school program. Students can arrive to school from 8.30am although, please be aware that staff are not on yard duty until 8.45am. thank-you for your support in ensuring the supervision of everyone.

Keep Reading @ Home

As you know, we work extremely hard to provide the highest quality learning for all students at our school. In order for us to maximise on student capabilities we require your help. As parents and guardians you have a crucial role to play within the learning framework. Your assistance at home in discussing school is an invaluable aspect of student learning. This provides opportunities for students to reflect and consolidate their understandings. As a minimum it would be fantastic to set aside some time each night to share a love of literacy. Reading to your child, reading with them, listening to them read to you and discussing the book (pictures, themes, characters, plot, setting, what might happen next etc..) are all helpful ways of engaging with your child around literacy. Reading each night forms a part of the homework for all students at WHPS.

Crossing Roads

We regularly hear feedback of times when some of our students don't display safe practices when crossing nearby roads. Students are reminded to concentrate when travelling around roads and especially when crossing roads. We have two crossings that are provided to support students travelling to and from school safely. Please utilize these crossings. We have observed many students and families crossing Elder St in particular at the school exit gate rather than via the crossing. This is quite dangerous.

Additionally, students are reminded that the wearing of helmets is compulsory for anyone riding or scooting to school. Parents are also reminded to please observe local parking restrictions as we often have local council officers patrolling the neighboring streets and issuing fines accordingly.

School Zones

Children are our most vulnerable road users and to address this road safety issue school speed zones with lower speed limits were introduced many years ago.

Motorists should be aware that children in traffic are not like adults. They can be unpredictable and because they are small, they can be hard to see. So take extra care and slow down when you drive past any school. Research shows that slowing down helps to both avoid crashes and reduce their severity. According to the Monash University Accident Research Centre, an 11 per cent reduction in speed reduces road deaths by 40 per cent. Even a small reduction in travelling speed dramatically increases the chance of a child surviving a collision. Read more about safety on our roads via the Vicroads website. Please observe the parking restrictions and speed limits around the school. Local council and Victoria Police often patrol these areas.

Sunsmart

A reminder to ensure all students have an appropriate SunSmart hat to wear during term 4. Please make sure these are adequately named and labelled to avoid lost property. Please be aware that school hats (black wide brimmed) are part of our compulsory uniform.


STEAM Challenge Day
