Our middle and senior school students will also participate in a condensed water safety program including some fun day activities later in the term.

Kelly Club Info:

Below you will find a welcome letter and some additional information from our new OHSC provider from 2026. Kelly Club will be progressively sharing information with our community across this term about their fee structure and how to make bookings etc. They will be organising a coffee van and a meet and greet session in the morning on Thursday 27th November. This will be a great opportunity to meet some key members of the team and learn more about the service in preparation for 2026. Kelly Club will be operating a school holiday program beginning on the 12th January 2026.

2026 School Fees:

You will have received the 2025 school fee documentation in school bags on Friday. We ask that you complete this paperwork and return to the school as soon as practicable. This does not need to include payments at this stage, but simply returning the documentation will allow us to prepare for the 2026 school year in establishing your family accounts for next year.

We are committed to providing a comprehensive learning program that involves many disciplines and subject areas. Our ongoing challenge is to continue to provide these experiences in a way that provides a depth and thoroughness for our students. Remembrance Day:

The 11th of November marks the anniversary of the armistice which ended the First World War (1914-18). Each year Australians observe one minute silence at 11am on the 11th November, in memory of those who died or suffered in all wars and armed conflicts. We remember those who made the ultimate sacrifice for our country and acknowledge the ongoing efforts of those special people who continue to serve our great nation. In addition to our school captains and vice captains representing our school at the ceremony at Watsonia RSL and laying a wreath, our staff and students will take time on this day to pay our respects and reflect on their sacrifice at school



SunSmart:

Despite the current wet weather, it's important to remember to remain SunSmart during the SunSmart period when UV readings are often at their highest levels (even on overcast days). It's important that our students come to school each day with their school hat clearly labelled with their name and that they are wearing it when outdoors.



Key Dates:

A couple of key dates to list in your calendar. We have a **Curriculum Day on Monday the 15th December**. Our teaching teams will be completing Term 1 planning for next year on this day. **Our last day of school is Friday 19th December. On this day we will have a final school assembly at 1:00pm with a 1:30pm finish to the school day.**

Transitions:

We continue to conduct our 2026 Prep Transition program. This is an important opportunity for next year's prep students to become familiar with WHPS life and get to know school routines and each other. We have already conducted 2 transition sessions with another three to go including one this week on Wednesday.

Our Year 6 students will also be undergoing an important transition at the end of this year. In preparation the statewide transition day for State Secondary Schools will be conducted on Tuesday 9th December. Those attending public secondary colleges will attend their new school on this day.

We are also gearing up our Internal transition program across the school. This is being done less formally than in the past with students participating in a range of activities across the term in mixed grade groupings. This approach gives both students and teachers the opportunity to experience and observe a range of group dynamics across the level informing the formation of 2026 grades.

Canteen Parent Helpers:

The WHPS Canteen welcomes volunteers. Anyone can help out. All you need is a Working with Children Check and have signed our school Volunteer form. Volunteering in the canteen is a great way to meet other parents and to give back to our fantastic school. Friday is the most popular day for lunch orders, so volunteers on a Friday are greatly encouraged and appreciated. Without our wonderful volunteers on this day, we would not be able to offer the full canteen service to the students. Working Bee:

We also have a Working Bee scheduled after school for this coming Friday the 14th November. Working Bees are a great opportunity to get to know others in the community. It is also a way to contribute to making the school grounds look great and to assist us to better reflect the great teaching and learning that is going on inside the walls.

Likely tasks to be completed on this afternoon are painting external wooden structures such as outdoor seating, spreading mulch, pruning bushes, sweeping, pulling weeds and other gardening related tasks.

Off-Site Evacuation

Notices will be sent this week to remind families of our upcoming Off-Site Evacuation drill this Thursday 13th November to Central Park. Every year, the Department of Education requires schools to conduct at least four emergency procedure drills across the four terms to practise for the unlikely event of a real emergency.

As all staff, students and visitors are required to participate in the drill for full compliance, the school office will be closed between 1.45pm and 2.30pm. Parents/carers are asked to ensure that student pick ups and drop offs occur outside of these times. Our drill will be attended by an OHS representative from the Department, who will be able to provide us with any feedback on how we can continue to make our drills efficient and safe for all involved.



From the eSafety Commissioner

From 10 December, Australian young people under 16 will not be allowed to create or hold accounts on certain social media platforms. This is not a ban, it's a delay to having accounts.



Being logged into an account increases the exposure under-16s have to design features that encourage them to spend more time on screens, while serving up content that can harm their health and wellbeing. The delay is an opportunity for them to build their digital literacy skills and resilience.

The restrictions are likely to apply to Facebook, Instagram, Kick, Reddit, Snapchat, Threads, TikTok, X, and YouTube, among other platforms.


